4. Once you have completed stitching the design, you can finish off the sign by adding a border. The border is simply a row of single crochet stitches worked around the edge of the sign. To add the border, insert your yarn needle into the first hole on the edge of the sign and pull the yarn through. Then, insert the needle into the next hole and pull the yarn through again. Continue stitching in this manner, working all the way around the edge of the sign.
5. Once you have finished stitching the border, you can cut the yarn and weave in the ends. To weave in the ends, simply insert the yarn needle into the last hole you stitched and pull the yarn through. Then, insert the needle into the hole next to it and pull the yarn through again. Continue weaving in the ends in this manner until all of the ends are hidden.

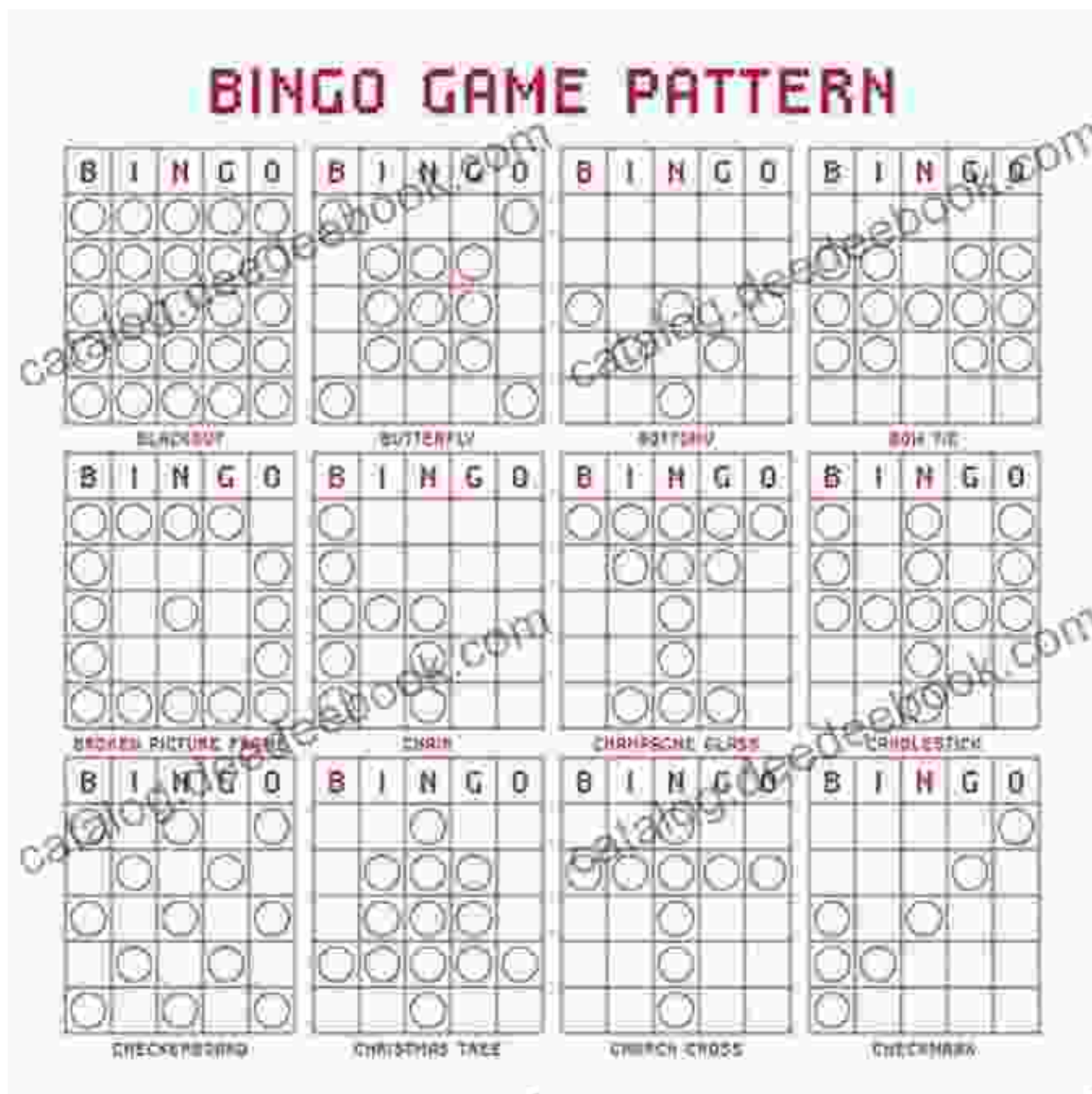


Variations
