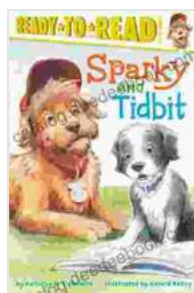


"No hitting," Sparky barked. He pointed to the spot right beside him. "Sit."
