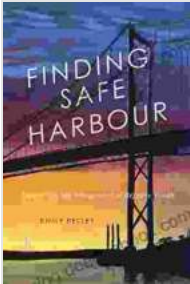

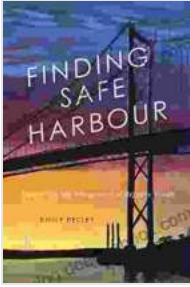
Evaluation and Impact
