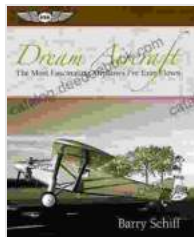

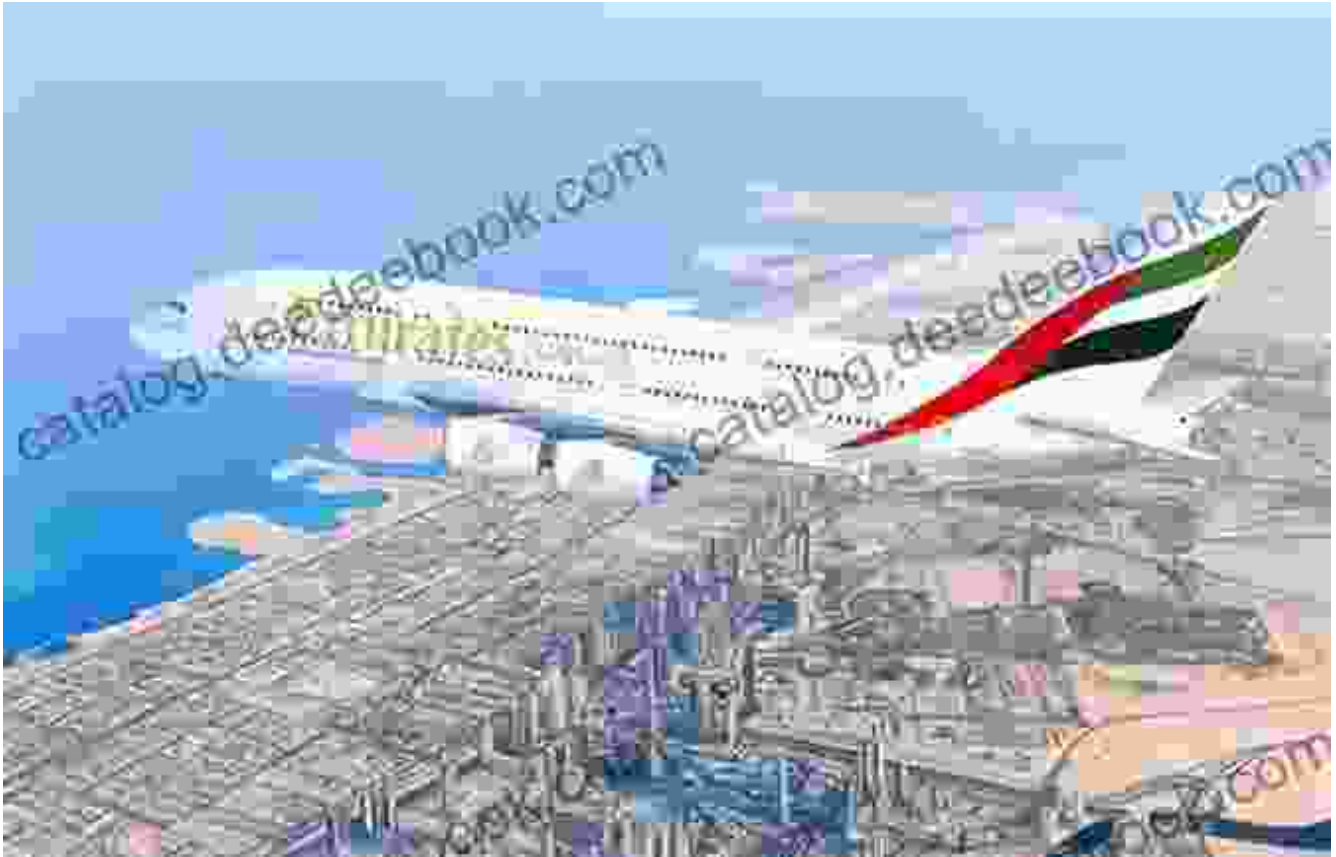
The Boeing 747

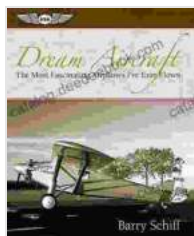
The Airbus A380
